ISACA Issues Guidance on Virtualized Desktop Infrastructure (VDI)

Rolling Meadows, IL, USA (22 May 2012)—Today's mobile users are demanding to access data from anywhere at any time. According to an annual ISACA survey on BYOD security, the use of mobile applications has nearly tripled since 2011, and two-thirds of employees aged 18 to 34 use a personal device for work purposes. While the productivity benefits are obvious, the likelihood of a security breach if a device is lost or stolen is also dramatically increased.

Virtual desktop infrastructure (VDI) allows users to access applications and data securely from remote locations with minimal risk of data loss, while simplifying desktop management within the traditional boundaries of the enterprise. With VDI, data is stored on a centralized server rather than the device itself.

To help enterprises realize the benefits of VDI adoption and understand the security concerns associated with it, global nonprofit IT association ISACA has issued a white paper titled *Virtualized Desktop Infrastructure (VDI)*, available as a free download at www.isaca.org/vdi. The paper spells out how to develop strategies to mitigate VDI threats and names enablers that can help with its adoption.

CISM, CRISC Among Highest-Paying IT Certifications

ISACA's Certified Information Security Manager (**CISM**) and Certified in Risk and Information Systems Control (**CRISC**) credentials were named two of the highest-paying IT certifications in the latest Foote Partners' *IT Skills and Certifications Pay Index*[™] (ITSCPI). CRISC is highly desired because it is the only certification that positions IT professionals for future career growth by linking IT risk management to enterprise risk management. Over 16,000 professionals in IT, security, audit and compliance have earned the CRISC designation since it was established in April 2010.
